

Core Pathways

Core safeguarding learning pathways have been developed as a modular programme which builds learning according to role. Therefore, these pathways should be completed in consecutive order until an individual has reached the required highest level of learning for their role.

<p>Basic Awareness</p>  <p>For everyone within Church communities who need to have a basic awareness of safeguarding issues.</p>	<p>Foundations</p>  <p>For those who hold positions of responsibility for the safeguarding of others within church settings.</p>	<p>Leadership</p>  <p>For all those who are in positions of safeguarding leadership within church settings.</p>	<p>Senior Leadership</p>  <p>A course for senior leaders that aims to connect the Church's mission and theological foundations with safeguarding principles.</p>
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Additional Pathways

<p>Raising Awareness of Domestic Abuse</p>  <p>A specialist course exploring the nature and dynamics of domestic abuse, with a focus on</p>	<p>Safer Recruitment and People Management</p>  <p>For all those involved in the recruitment, selection and management of staff or</p>
